Terms of Membership 2023



We are dedicated to the enrichment and education of our community through the Arts. Our mission is to provide space and opportunities to local artists so they can share their knowledge, show their work, and inspire others to embrace Art in all of its forms.

Work will be accepted based on quality of workmanship, originality and the available space through a juried process. We accept images by email, or by appointment.

Work will be displayed in groupings designed to enhance the artistic beauty throughout the gallery.

**All members must pay an annual fee to cover a portion of the gallery's fixed costs.
All fees must be paid up front in full at the time of renewal..**

Option #1 Non Working Membership: \$240./yr no days sitting
Consignment rate: 60% (artist) 40%(ArtWorks)

Option #2 Working Membership: \$80/Yr. 10 days (20 half days) per year
Consignment rate: 60% (artist) 40%(ArtWorks)

Option #3 Working Membership: \$60/Yr. 14 days (28 half days) per year
Consignment Rate 70% (artist) 30% (ArtWorks)

If you have questions, please review with a board member

- ◆ Members get a 10% discount on purchases and workshops at ArtWorks.
- ◆ Artists may be asked to change out work regularly in order to keep the display fresh and new. Artists must drop off their work at the gallery for display by appointment only with a Board member. Amount of inventory will vary by artist and media. (see below).
- ◆ Days worked need not be the same day/s every month as long as you fulfill your commitment of days within the annual period.
- ◆ If your commitment is not fulfilled at the end of your annual period you will be charged a pro rated amount of \$180.
- ◆ Sign up to work with Signup Genius and on the paper calendar.
- ◆ Artists must fill out a W9 form. (tax purposes) New members must submit with completed application, Artist Bio, artist statement and 2 photos
- ◆ Artist's payment checks are issued monthly. Sales reports will be emailed to each artist.
- ◆ Sorry, we do not have adequate storage space for artwork over the allowed pieces. Any artwork left unclaimed after 30 days will become the property of Art Works LLC.

Inventory Guidelines: Work will be accepted and displayed at the discretion of the gallery directors, based on space and aesthetic considerations. The goal is to be as fair as possible to all artists involved and to create the most pleasing display possible.

- **Wall Art** (photography, paintings, print, and paper) up to 6 pieces. Matted and sleeved prints as space allows.
- **Cards** Up to 25 images, as space allows
- **Jewelry** As space allows
- **Approved 3D Art** (clay, fiber, stone, wood, glass) As space allows

Here's a sample of a short artist's bio:

Phillip Estine is a contemporary abstract painter and part-time curator for the Foo Gallery in Waterloo, ON. He received a MFA Degree from the University of Waterloo, and has participated in over 20 group shows and 10 solo shows in the United States and Canada. He has lived in Toronto, New York, and San Francisco, and is currently residing in Kitchener. His paintings are mostly oil on canvas and his signature work consists of bright, bold colours, with heavily-layered impasto effects.

Artist's Statement

You may also provide a personalized artist's statement. Remember, if you're not present when your work is being viewed, the artist's statement is your proxy to the viewer, and perhaps your one chance to explain what you're doing. When writing your statement, imagine talking to a potential customer while standing in front of your best work. Next, imagine explaining the piece to them.

What's usually covered in an artist statement:

- Always written in the 1st person (I, me, my)
- What inspires you
- What you want to say
- What you are creating
- What your work is like
- What your challenges are
- Your philosophy/politics/technique

Here's a sample of a short artist's statement:

My work explores the dichotomy between nature and urban spaces. What starts out as hope soon becomes corrupted, leaving only a sense of failure, but with the chance of a new opportunity.

I don't set out determined to produce art about any given subject. My sketchbook is always close at hand, so I am constantly drawing, perfecting my craft. Sometimes the drawings are left in the sketchbook and other times they develop into more in-depth ideas and detailed images.

Each project often consists of multiple works, often in a range of different media, grouped around specific themes and meanings. During research and production new areas of interest arise and lead to the next body of work.
